ISSUE OF UNIFORMS MEMORANDUM

- 1. The purpose of this document is to provide an understanding between the Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (MCJROTC) Senior Marine Instructor (SMI), the cadet, and his/her parent(s)/guardians(s) regarding uniform responsibilities. To accomplish this task the schools in conjunction with the Senior Marine Instructor need your help.
- 2. The MCJROTC program stresses accountability as well as responsibility to each cadet. However, parent(s)/guardians(s) should understand that their son/daughter will receive a minimum issue of uniforms valued at approximately \$210.25 for wear during the time they are participating in the JROTC program. It is important each cadet as well as their parent(s)/guardian(s) understand that all uniform items must be turned in at the end of the course to the MCJROTC instructors in the MCJROTC classroom(s) and not to a school administrator in one of the offices. If uniforms are lost or damaged due to negligence the cadet and or their parent(s)/guardians(s) must pay for any repair, or cost to replace each item.

- 10. I will take responsibility for all my actions and their consequences whether good or bad.

Marksmanship training is taught to acquaint the cadet with the principles and basic skills of rifle marksmanship, and provide a general knowledge of characteristics, operations, and maintenance of individual weapons. The most important aspect taught is the necessity of strict adherence to safety precautions and safety procedure when handling any weapon. The only weapon fired in MCJROTC is the single shot .177 caliber pellet air rifle.

DEMERIT SYSTEM

Discipline is one of the hallmarks of the United States Marine Corps and also the foundation of education. One of the major components of the mission of the Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps is to strengthen character by instilling habits of self-discipline. In this context we have designated a Demerit System that is designed to evaluate and motivate cadets to practice self-discipline. This system will also provide a tool in which to counsel cadets in an effort to correct and mentor them to become not just better cadets but also better students. Cadets who accumulate demerits will receive a discipline grade at the end of each of these weeks. This discipline grade will carry the weight of a test grade and will reflect points lost for disciplinary infractions committed during class or any reported infractions from other teachers and administrators who never hesitate to email me on negative student behavior. A preponderance of demerits will be awarded due to violations of basic school policies such as talking in class, sleeping in class, disrupting the class, and cell phone violations. Some disciplinary violations are unique to MCJROTC such as improper behavior in formation, and unwillingness to maintain the position of attention. This listing is not all inclusive but just a sampling. To quote General George Washington in a letter to his captains of the Virginia Regiments:

"Discipline is the soul of an army. It makes small numbers formidable; procures success to the weak and esteem to all."

Our goal is not to train an army but to promote strong character traits in our students. As Gen. Washington indicated, discipline "makes small numbers formidable." For Young people who doubt their abilities, self-discipline will demonstrate that they are capable of more than they realize. In reference to the latter part of Gen. Washington's quote, a measure of well-deserved self-esteem is a great encourager.
